





ANTIGUA CRUISE PORT LAUNCHES CERTIFIED CRUISE PORT AMBASSADOR PROGRAM

Antigua Cruise Port proudly launched its Certified Cruise Port Ambassador program in partnership with the Ministry of Tourism and Investment last week in preparation for the country's cruising comeback. Fifty participants from various sectors of the tourism industry, including taxi drivers, tour operators, retailers, St John's Development Corporation and Antigua Cruise Port staff were led through ten hours of intensive training to complete the free course over two days. The event was held at the Heritage Quay Hotel.

The group was previously guided through certification program facilitated by the Ministry of Tourism on effective COVID-19 protocols. Andre Norton, Health, Safety, and Environment Supervisor at Antigua Cruise Port facilitated the session on International Ship and Port Facility Security Code (ISPS) Awareness training, Claudine Pohl of Lemoneight Inc. hosted a "Building Consumer Confidence in the Cruise Industry" session to support the participants customer service goals. The Museum of Antigua & Barbuda is scheduled to wrap up the event with a thorough review of the history of Antigua & Barbuda with a focus on the St John's Ports to help reacquaint the participants with details about the country's history that would interest visitors.

The Hon. Charles Fernandez, Minister of Tourism & Investment, expressed his ministry's support of the event. "We were very pleased to support this initiative. This kind of training strengthens and empowers industry partners by helping us to restart in a manner that will make us, the wider community, and our guests much safer. We applaud the Antigua Cruise Port team for spearheading this initiative to manage the uncertainty of this next phase of reopening by leading with confidence."

Minister Fernandez added that, "It was also very heart-warming to see participants from various sectors working together toward our common goal." Mrs. **Dona Regis-Prosper, General Manager of Antigua Cruise Port**, described the goal of the training program. "We developed this program because we know how important it is for us to continue to distinguish Antigua & Barbuda from other ports and other countries, particularly during this very competitive period when many destinations in the hemisphere are restarting. During our technical calls, we have taken all necessary precautions in cooperation with the officials of the General Directorate of Border and Coast, Bodrum Port Authority, Bodrum Marine Police and Bodrum Customs Directorate. The successful operation is an important reference for future calls."

Thanks to the Turkish Government's prioritization of the Travel & Tourism industry for vaccination against the COVID-19, and the company-wide vaccination program, Bodrum Cruise Port is ready to welcome both passengers and crew for Transit and Turnaround operations.

Situated on an exquisite peninsula, Bodrum is undoubtedly one of the most attractive coastal cities in Turkey, appealing to both Turkish and foreign holidaymakers. Bodrum is located on the Aegean coast of Turkey, and in addition to its luxury tourist destinations, it boasts several major historical sites, including the Castle of Saint Peter, the Museum of Underwater Archaeology, King Mausolus' Mausoleum (one of the seven wonders of the ancient world), and a Roman amphitheater. Apart from the cruise pier, the port boasts quays that can harbor up to 30 mega-yachts, and has three ferryboat ramps. The state-of-the-art terminal building offers diverse facilities including duty free shopping areas, travel agencies and a restaurant.



EGE PORT KUSADASI LOOKING TO ESTABLISH COLD-IRONING SYSTEM

KUSADASI, TURKEY

The Maritime Decarbonisation Initiative has been started by the EU Turkish Delegation in cooperation with public authorities. In this respect, Mr. Panayotis Zacharioudakis and Mr. M. Kemal Battal visited Ege Port Kusdasi, the busiest cruise port in Turkey in order to discuss the possibility of establishing a cold-ironing system that would cater 4 mega ships simultaneously.

Mr. **Aziz Gungor, Regional Director of GPH East Med Ports and Ege Port Kusadasi General Manager**: "As Ege Port Kusadasi, we aim to render services which are environmental friendly, safe to meet the satisfaction of both the customers and employees, compliant with the both domestic and international laws and regulations, providing international port safety services and standards with its dynamism, reliability and valued team. A potential project in establishes the cold-ironing system will help us reach our target which is to dramatically reduce our carbon footprint."

Shore power technologies are the only solutions that cut emissions totally at berth. Shore power enables the connection of ships in port to shoreside electricity to power on-board services, allowing the generators to be switched off, which reduces the emissions.

Ege Port Kusadasi, is the busiest port in Turkey, hosting over 500k passengers annually. Situated on the west coast of Turkey, Kuşadası is one of the most appealing towns of the Aegean and is close to many historical sites. The dynamic cruise port and beach resort town of Kuşadası is the gateway to Ephesus, which is among the most visited ancient cities in the Mediterranean.

MALAGA RECEIVES 1ST CRUISE SHIP CALL UPON RESTART OF OPERATIONS TUI CRUISES: MEIN SCHIFF 2

MALAGA, SPAIN

Málaga became today the first port in Spain's mainland to host a cruise ship upon restart of operations after 15 months stop. TUI Cruises' Mein Schiff 2 restarted cruise operations in our destination guaranteeing safety in operations and shorex.

Representatives from the Port and the destination have met Mr. Tom Roth, Captain from Mein Schiff 2, and handed a commemorating plaque of this very special event.

Mrs. **Susana Gutierrez, General Manager of Malaga Cruise Port** said: "We are delighted to share with all the cruise community the news about the restart of operations in Málaga with the Mein Schiff 2 calling on the 15th June with 1st cruise call at Spain Mainland.

It has been indeed a historical moment for us and for the cruise industry in Spain as well as a clear evidence about the gradual recovery of the Tourism and Economy in our country after the pandemics. We expect this to be the first of many other successful international calls to come this year."

Mr. **Tom Roth, Captain Mein Schiff 2,** highlighted that "this is the beginning of a beautiful friendship".

In Málaga, cruise passengers visited the city and other towns nearby in small groups, having chosen emblematic places of the historical city center of Málaga, as well as Ronda, Mijas or Marbella, among others, supporting the recovery of the economy.

Mein Schiff 2 arrived from the Canary Islands, with 1,275 passengers, then she will depart for Palma de Mallorca to start Spanish national itineraries. She will be visiting Málaga again on June 22nd and July 6th.



THE VALLETTA GRAND HARBOUR CLEAN AIR PROJECT - THE DEVELOPMENT OF SHORE TO SHIP ELECTRICITY INFRASTRUCTURE IN VALLETTA

VALLETTA, MALTA

Valletta Cruise Port is supporting a \notin 49.9 million initiative spearheaded by the Ministry for Transport, Infrastucture and Capital Projects, Infrastructure Malta and Transport Malta to develop shore-side electricity infrastructure as part of the Grand Harbour Clean Air Project. This includes a \notin 37 million investment to provide shore power on the five main cruise ship quays of the Grand Harbour by the end of 2023. Valletta's Grand Harbour will be one of the European leaders in shore-supply provision for cruise ships.

Work commenced in November 2020, and is ongoing on a number of quays around the port. The project will result in major air quality improvements with drastic reductions in emissions in the Grand Harbour. This innovative system will make it possible to reduce the emissions of pollutant gases, specifically the port will be able to reduce SOx, NOx, CO2 and PM emissions. Furthermore the project will help reduce noise pollution and vibrations in port also contributing to improved quality of life for all port users. As an additional bonus, the shore power project will indirectly help in the conservation of historic buildings in the area.


